Headlines



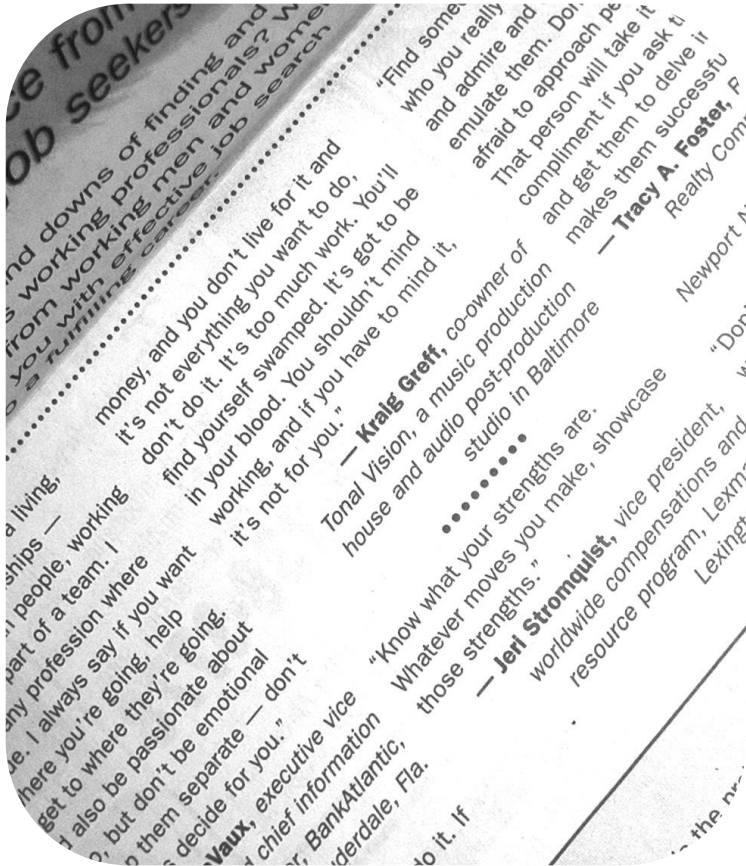
Orientation

This introduces the story and should **GRAB** a reader's attention.
It will set the scene and summarise the main points of the article.
It is often only one sentence so you must make it a good one.

- **Who?**
- **What?**
- **When?**
- **Where?**



Main body of the text



- Past tense
- Paragraphs
- Clear sentences
- It answers why and how

Photo or image

- The photo or image shows us a snapshot of:
 - **What** happened
 - **Where** it happened
 - **Who** it happened to.
- It should make the reader “feel something” so that they want to read the article.
- If possible it should show action.

Caption

A **caption** goes underneath a photo to identify something or someone and to give us more information.

A **caption** is a label for the photograph!
